- Holden produced Gypsy Major, Gray Marine and 4 cylinder radial torpedo aeroplane engines during World War II





Member's Cars

Andrew & Val Ladlay's FJ HOLDEN UTE

The ute was built at General Motors Holdens' Fortitude Valley plant in December 1956. It has been continuously registered since then with the same registration number.





It was once owned by actor John Jarratt (Wolf Creek) – see above left. Andrew purchased it in 1992 and used it as a daily driver until 2004 when it underwent a substantial restoration.

The engine is an FB Holden 138 cubic inch "grey", but otherwise running gear is generally FJ. The bodywork is original, painted in GM "Sting Red" 2-pack.

It carries most of the modifications it had when purchased in 1992, plus a few more "period" upgrades, including lowered suspension with front sway bar, 13x6" and 14x7" wheels with radial tyres, white walls, and "Moon" hubcaps, a brake booster, twin carburettors, extractors and 2" exhaust, an alloy twinbreather tappet cover, EH Holden headlights and Lucas "D" stop/tail lights.
