



Member's Cars

Current vehicles:

1986 Holden Commodore VL- SL Turbo 295150 km.

2004 Holden Commodore VZ SV6 114820 km.

I have owned these vehicles since new, although the turbo was purchased by Shell Co as a company car, which I purchased from them on leaving the Company in 1987. This was a quirk of the company car policy of the then treasurer, Paul Keating. Shell set strict rules as they did not want these "powerful" cars in their fleet, however because I and my brother were competing in state rally championships and were used to driving "powerful" vehicles, they purchased my car from the Petrie Holden dealer for my use only.

Both of these vehicles have been mainly used for family transport, although the turbo was used to tow my 16 foot pop top caravan. The SV6 was purchased from Wangaratta Holden dealer as the local Toyota dealer had purchased the Holden dealership and he was a sponsor for my brothers Toyota Celica GT4 rally car.

Holdens have been the main vehicles used by members of my family since the 50s.

My first Holden was a 1954 FJ, NSW rego, left to me when my grandfather died. This vehicle was replaced by a Morris 1100 S and the FJ was sold to purchase a block of land.

The next car was a 1971 Holden Torana SL, purchased from my mother in 1979 when she purchased a VB Commodore. As this car had very few miles, and I had driven it mainly, it was an almost new vehicle and became my wife's car. My mother was not the most confident driver and was terrifying my young daughters in the commodore some years later.

Upon moving to South Australia I purchased a new VB Commodore SL, thanks to the company car scheme and the Torana was sold. I had a new Datsun 240K which my wife used in lieu of the Torana.

After moving from Adelaide to Brisbane, this green commodore was stolen from a carpark in Aspley and was found 9 months later as a badly damaged vehicle, although we had been paid out by the insurer.

A move to Ford Falcon XE Ghia ESP, which eventually was replaced by the turbo.

My brother loaned me a VL Brock Commodore for 8 months as he had purchased a new VL "Walkinshaw" Commodore. I only used this car occasionally as it had to haves some miles for tax purposes.

My wife purchased a Holden Astra from a neighbour who had the car from new. I then purchased the SV6 IN 2004.

Since then my vehicles have been company utes as I was employed on various construction sites and our vehicles were stored regularly for some time.

I wanted to purchase a special vehicles GTS Commodore, however the car would have been stored.

We have at least 8 Holdens owned by other members of my family so I am confident that I have finally joined a Holden owners club, now that work is not all consuming.
